1. \_\_\_\_: charged or concerned with acts against a government or a political system.
2. \_\_\_\_: a person experienced in the art or science of government, especially one actively engaged in conducting the business of a government.
3. \_\_\_\_: related to or involving the policy or practice of a political party.
4. \_\_\_\_: the art or science of government; the art or science concerned with winning and holding control over a government; political actions, practices or policies; political life especially as a principal activity or profession; political activities characterized by artful and often dishonest practices.
5. \_\_\_\_: the political opinions or sympathies of a person.
6. \_\_\_\_: relations or conduct in a particular area of experience, especially as seen or dealt with from a political point of view.
7. \_\_\_\_: of or relating to government, a government, or the conduct of government.
8. \_\_\_\_: a social science concerned chiefly with the description and analysis of political and especially governmental institutions and processes.
9. \_\_\_\_: conforming to a belief that language and practices which could offend political sensibilities (as in matters of sex or race) should be eliminated.
10. \_\_\_\_: the theory or study of the role of public policy in influencing the economic and social welfare of a political unit.
