** *Lexical vs Grammatical Words in EVM* **

Word-classes (or parts of speech):

- **nouns**¹: apparatus, canine, cell, epidemic, flu, heifer, herd, isolate, livestock, outbreak, oxygen, prion, scientist, surgeon, surgery, vaccine, virus, ...
- **verbs**²: (to) breed, (to) deal with, (to) isolate) (to) lay, (to) lei, (to) spread, (to) suffer from, ...
- **adjectives**⁴: canine, epidemic, infectious, mellitus, mild, wild, ...
- **adverbs**⁵: carefully, highly, importantly, often, slowly, very ...

- **auxiliary and modal verbs**
- **adverbs of time and place**
- **prepositions**: at, about, in, of, on, ...
- **pronouns**: I, me, you, them, that, who ...
- **articles and determiners**: a, the, this, my, ...
- **conjunctions and linking words**: and; according to; both ... and; but, in order to; either ... or; neither ... nor; the former ... the latter; ...
- **interjections**
